Grant funds are disbursed to recipients, such as County Departments, Municipalities and Non-Profit groups, educational institutions and local businesses serving low- and moderate-income households and /or communities within Clayton County. Grant applications are done on a yearly basis.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

In general, the CDBG Program works with several county departments, municipalities, nonprofits, and other groups working to address the needs of Clayton County's low – and –moderate income residents in the areas mentioned above. The County's CDBG funding assists communities in addressing a wide range of needs which include:

- Providing decent housing and suitable living environments.
- Developing solutions to expand economic opportunities.
- Addressing slum and blight removal throughout the County.
- Completing public infrastructure and public facilities improvements in lowand moderate-income eligible areas within the County.
- Administering the County's Essential Home Repair Program.
- Supporting several public service activities including but not limited to senior services, youth programs.

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

Within Clayton County, ESG funds are primarily utilized to support emergency shelter operations and homelessness prevention services such as rent and utility assistance. Federal guidelines also allow funds to be used for rapid rehousing, street outreach and HMIS database management. Within these program areas, families in need may also gain assistance with housing searches, landlord-tenant mediation, legal services, credit repair, childcare assistance, transportation and relocation costs.

HOME Investment Partnership (HOME)

The HOME program supports activities addressing affordable housing needs within the County. Funding has provided downpayment assistance to income-eligible first-time homebuyers. Additionally, HOME funds are allocated to the County's designated Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO), which assists in the development of new construction and rehabilitated homes.
